1. BACKGROUND

1.1. The Northern Territory Clay Target Association Inc. (NTCTA) has implemented the following criteria to acknowledge, celebrate and memorialise the prowess and skill of its clay target shooting members in the Northern Territory.

2. INDUCTEE

- 2.1. A NTCTA Hall of Fame Inductee shall receive a Gold NT badge, and commemorative plaque.
- 2.2. Points can only be gained whilst the shooter is registered with the ACTA as a member of a NTCTA affiliated club.
- 2.3. If the State Body feels that due to illness or age etc. a member should be entered early, the NTCTA Executive must vote and agree unanimously (100%). At a minimum the member should have obtained 50 points within the selected discipline.
- 2.4. The disciplines in which a shooter can be inducted into the NTCTA Hall of Fame are as follows:
 - Down the Line (DTL);
 - Skeet;

- ISSF;
- Sporting Clays; and
- Multi-discipline.

3. DOWN THE LINE (DTL)

- 3.1. A shooter must qualify with 100 points in solely DTL events.
- 3.2. The order of induction into the NTCTA Hall of Fame is based on the total number of points earned.
- 3.3. In the event that two or more people are equal on points then the order of entry will be based upon the following order:
 - (a) The competitor who won the earliest State title.
 - (b) If still tied then the competitor with a National Title.
 - (c) If still tied then the competitor with the most National Titles.
 - (d) If still tied then the competitor who won a National Title first.

3.4. Qualifying Titles are:

- i. State Open category only
- ii. 10 points DB, SB, PS, H/Cap, Champ/Champ, Team High Gun & Overall High Gun.
- iii. 20 points National Titles (as above) and 10 points for Runner up.
- iv. 50 Points World Championship and 20 points for Runner up.

4. SKEET

- 4.1. A shooter must qualify with 100 points in solely Skeet events.
- 4.2. . The order of induction into the NTCTA Hall of Fame is based on the total number of points earned.
- 4.3. In the event that two or more people are equal on points then the order of entry will be based upon the following order:
 - (a) The competitor who won the earliest State title.
 - (b) If still tied then the competitor with a National Title.
 - (c) If still tied then the competitor with the most National Titles.
 - (d) If still tied then the competitor who won a National Title first.

4.4. Qualifying Titles are open category in:

- (i) 10 points State Titles in Skeet, Skeet Handicap, 20 Gauge, Skeet Doubles, Team High Gun, Overall High Gun.
- (ii) 20 points National Titles and 10 points for Runner up.
- (iii) 50 Points World Championship and 20 points for Runner up.

5. ISSF

- 5.1. A shooter must qualify with 100 points in solely ISSF events.
- 5.2. The order of induction into the NTCTA Hall of Fame is based on the total number of

points earned.

- 5.3. In the event that two or more people are equal on points then the order of entry will be based upon the following order:
 - (a) The competitor who won the earliest State title.
 - (b) If still tied then the competitor with a National Title.
 - (c) If still tied then the competitor with the most National Titles.
 - (d) If still tied then the competitor who won a National Title first.
- 5.4. Qualifying Titles are open category in:
 - (i) 10 points State Titles in ISSF Skeet, ISSF Trap and ISSF Double Trap.
- (ii) 20 points National Titles and 10 points for Runner up.
- (iii) 50 Points Gold Medallist World Championship, World Cup and Commonwealth Games and 20 points for Runner up.
- (iv) 100 Points Olympic Games Gold Medallist

6. SPORTING CLAYS

- 6.1. A shooter must qualify with 100 points in solely Sporting Clays events.
- 6.2. The order of induction into the NTCTA Hall of Fame is based on the total number of points earned.
- 6.3. In the event that two or more people are equal on points then the order of entry will be based upon the following order:
 - (a) The competitor who won the earliest State title.
 - (b) If still tied then the competitor with a National Title.
 - (c) If still tied then the competitor with the most National Titles.
 - (d) If still tied then the competitor who won a National Title first.
- 6.4. Qualifying Titles are open category in:
 - (i) 10 points State Titles in Sporting Clays.
- (ii) 20 points National Titles and 10 points for Runner up.
- (iii) 50 Points World Championship and 20 points for Runner up.

7. MULTI-DISCIPLINE

- 7.1. A shooter must qualify with 120 points across all Hall of Fame eligible disciplines.
- 7.2. The order of induction into the NTCTA Hall of Fame is based on the total number of points earned.
- 7.3. In the event that two or more people are equal on points then the order of entry will be based upon the following order:
 - (a) The competitor who won the earliest State title.
 - (b) If still tied then the competitor with a National Title.
 - (c) If still tied then the competitor with the most National Titles.
 - (d) If still tied then the competitor who won a National Title first.
