#### 1. BACKGROUND

1.1. The Northern Territory Clay Target Association (**NTCTA**) is committed to providing an environment that is safe while participating in the sport of clay target shooting.

1.2. Pursuant of the Rules of the ACTA, the duties of a Shoot Marshall include:

- (a) He must observe all the duties of the official referee.
- (b) He must be present at all shoot-offs.
- (c) He must see that all traps are checked for correct height and angles during the competition and prior to shoot-off.
- (d) The Shoot Marshall shall be in charge of all operations and personnel, including referees relating to the shoot, and shall be responsible only to the Management.
- (e) He must instruct and roster the duties of all personnel prior to the commencement of each day's shooting.

## **2. POLICY**

- 2.1. In order to comply with insurance requirements and other purposes, all clubs are to ensure that they have a designated Shoot Marshall for every event and that the Shoot Marshall is made aware of his/her duties prior to the competition commencing.
- 2.2. All clubs affiliated with the NTCTA must ensure that the Shoot Marshall is:
  - (a) Clearly identified prior to and during a competition; and
  - (b) A member with sufficient experience to undertake their duties pursuant to the ACTA Rules.
- 2.3. In circumstances of an injury or serious breach of the ACTA shooting rules, the Shoot Marshall may be required to provide a statement to the relevant authority. Such statement may include:
  - (a) their duties on the day of the incident;
  - (b) their qualifications; and
  - (c) any other information that may be relevant to the investigation.
- 2.4. This policy should be read in conjunction with the Shooting Rules of the ACTA and *Firearms Act 2007* and Regulations.
